1. On page 5, Staffing and Language Assistance, list the current languages your county is required to cover.
 - a. Identify if locations will have staffing with Spanish and Vietnamese speakers or if the county will utilize the call-in interpreter services provided by the SOS.
2. On page 5, Accessible Ballot and Aides for Voters with Disabilities, further clarify that the ballot marking device is available for all voters to use and that they may use it.
3. On page 6, Equipment, identify the vendor, if known.
4. On page 7, Locations, state whether maps used to establish drop box locations will be available in print or other form accessible without internet connection.
5. On page 10, General Requirements, 2nd paragraph, list any groups involved in this project.
6. On Page 15 of the EAP, include the time(s) and location(s) of the workshop(s), if known.
