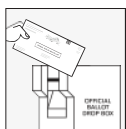

The California Voter's Choice Act (VCA) modernizes voting by providing voters in select counties with more convenient ways to cast their ballot.

You may return your completed ballot by doing one of the following:



Mailing it.



Using a county drop box.



Visiting a vote center.

Registered voters can vote in person at any vote center in their VCA counties.

Participating VCA counties include:

When do I vote?

- You will receive your ballot in the mail 28 days before the election. After completing your ballot, you may return it by mail or any county drop box or vote center. Vote centers will be open for in-person voting for 11 days up to and including Election Day.

Where do I find a drop box or vote center?

- To locate a drop box or vote center in your area please visit: VotersChoice.sos.ca.gov

What if I don't receive my ballot?

- Visit any vote center in your county or call your county registrar to request a replacement.

What can I do at a vote center?

At any location in your county for up to 11 days, including Election Day, you can:

- Vote in person
- Drop off your completed ballot
- Get a replacement ballot
- Vote using an accessible voting machine
- Get help and voting materials in multiple languages
- Register to vote or update your registration
